The alternative press is an enormous body of books, pamphlets, magazines, zines, and audiovisual and electronic materials presenting socially responsible knowledge, points of view, and choices. Its ideas and publications are often ignored, misrepresented, or suppressed by corporate and government media, and are overlooked by schools, universities, and libraries worldwide. *Counterpoise* describes, criticizes, defends, and promotes these publications and products against this bias.

For its first years (volume 1, number 1 – volume 4, number 2; January 1997 – April 2000) *Counterpoise* (ISSN 1092-0714) was published by the Alternatives in Print Task Force of the American Library Association's Social Responsibilities Round Table. Volume 4, numbers 3 and 4 (July and October 2000) were published by CRISES Press, Inc. Beginning with volume 5, number 1 (January 2001), *Counterpoise* became a project of the Civic Media Center and Library, Inc., a not-for-profit, 501(c)(3) tax-exempt, alternative library and reading room in Gainesville, Florida. Since the Fall of 2001 the magazine has operated as a collective. Beginning with volume 8, number 1/2, (Winter/Spring 2004) *Counterpoise* incorporates *Librarians at Liberty* (ISSN 1069-0832). *Counterpoise* and *Librarians at Liberty* are indexed in *Alternative Press Index* and *Book Review Index*. Their articles are accessible through the full-text database Alt-PressWatch and on microfilm from ProQuest, www.proquest.com (formerly University Microfilms).
